Silva Award for Services to Orienteering in New Zealand

Silva Award for Services to Orienteering in NZ for 2012: *Marquita Gelderman* (North West). Marquita has been involved in orienteering for 28 years having started the sport back

As a competitor, Marquita has:

- Competed for NZ at both World (foot-O) champs and World Cup events
- ° Won seven NZ W21E titles
- ° Placed 4th twice, 5th and 8th in Open Women's at the World MTBO champs, and as a result twice received Performance Enhancement Grants from SPARC (now Sport NZ).

A firm believer in putting back into sport what you get out of it, Marquita has been prominent in many organizing roles. At the national level Marquita was a member of the NZOF Selection Panel for many years, including being the convenor. She was also planner of the 2000 World Masters finals in the Manawatu, and has controlled three NZ champs, planned two Oceania events and

several Auckland champs—a total, all up, of 20 events.

In 2012, she was appointed to the NZOF Technical Committee, and in January of this year attended the IOF Event Adviser's Clinic held in Masterton. As a result of attendance there she has now been nominated by the NZOF to become an IOF Event Adviser.

On the club scene, Marquita has been North West's most prominent cartographer in OCAD mapping, having put in countless hours for the club. Not a year passes when she has not controlled or planned an event. She freely helps others with planning and using Sport Ident and is acknowledged for her accuracy and attention to detail. Bottom line—whenever Marquita has been involved one could expect a top-notch event.

I look forward to meeting you all over the forthcoming months and working to enhance NZOFs role in delivering a great sport to New Zealanders.




Orienteering orchids

The native orchid *Gastrodia cunninghamii* is one of the unique orchids that has no leaves, and no chlorophyll. It looks very much like a stick or frond of bracken – and even when it is known in a location it can be impossible to find because it doesn't come up from the tubers every year.

I was thrilled to find a specimen on the practice area on the middle distance course. It had about 20 seedpods wide open, showing firstly that it had a pollinator in the vicinity and secondly that the seed had been successfully dispersed.

The arrangement of the seedpods allowed identification of this species from the other *Gastrodia*.



I was delighted given our connection with Ngai Tahu that I found the special plant known to Maori as huperei, at Tūhaitara.

At the long distance event I came across a carpet of *Nematoceras aff. Trilobum* leaves. This is another small native orchid that rarely flowers, but when it does it is laden. It tends to grow vegetatively, sometimes for years, which explains Dalethorpe's typical wide spread of some metres. The habitat was true to type and it was guite reasonable to find these wee leaves.

The leaves were sufficiently distinct for me to identify these specimens among the many in the group comprising *nematoceras* and its relations.

If you think you have found orchids, check out the fabulous website www.nativeorchids.co.nz – it is the source of these two images.

As the mapping coordinator for the NZ Native Orchid Group happened to be one of our volunteer helpers, we established the identity of both species. This means that both our orchids have been added to the national database of recognised orchid locations. I set out to enjoy Nationals and this was an unexpected bonus.

Stop Press

Weeks after searchers had given up all hope, missing orienteer iDent 81 was found yesterday afternoon at Woodend Beach Forest.

Cold and alone but otherwise unhurt and with all faculties intact, 81 survived three weeks in the wild, coping with the recent cold and wet weather, and fending off the unwanted attention of local predators.

Interviewed after the ordeal, with energy flagging and clearly some loss of control, 81 was only able to reply with a faint beep. It appears that 81 followed a key rule, and stayed put in its original location

to give searchers the best chance finding it.

A spokesperson for the original search party, a Miss I.M. Blind, reported the last known location as 're-entrant, middle part' and this appears to correlate with where 81 was eventually picked up.

An investigation may be launched to see if any lessons can be learned from the episode, but efforts initially will be focused on the well-being of 81, which will be carefully separated into its component parts before being allowed to recover in the back of a damp garage.

Pan Pacific Sub-Junior Orienteering Challenge

Part of the 2013 Australian Orienteering Championships

The Pan Pacific (Sub) Junior Orienteering Challenge will create a friendly collaborative junior competition that facilitates networking of juniors at the 2013 Australian Championship Carnival.

The Challenge (ie the competition) is embedded into the Australian Championships and will take place through an organised team based scoring system. The Challenge will run over the first two days of the Australian Championships Carnival: Saturday 28th and Sunday 29th September 2013.

It will enable those who would otherwise be attending and competing entirely in a solo capacity to have an overlaying "team" competition in place. It also means those in the junior age groups who have not been selected in their respective States/territories teams the opportunity for some group competition.



The Challenge includes all boy and girl entrants of the Carnival in the 14 years and under A and B categories (excludes shadowed novice competitors). That is all entrants 1999 birth year and above who are orienteering independently.

The team based competition is based on States/Territories/jurisdictions and/or a combination depending on the number of attendees from each jurisdiction. Jurisdictions could include New Zealand and New Caledonia junior participants.

There is no need for any junior entrant to enter or run in additional races, to be part of this challenge simply compete the entry form as usual. There may be an additional field to complete to indicate the state/country that you are representing.

Teams will be organised based on entry numbers, with the final team combinations determined once entries have closed. It is hoped that 7 teams will be formed. It is anticipated that Qld, NSW, ACT, Vic and Tas would have sufficient numbers to create a "team". The remaining jurisdictions will be combined to form additional one or two teams depending on numbers. Or smaller jurisdictions will be included with the larger states resulting in 5 teams - with "visiting" members.

To enter all prospective entrants will enter as normal.

Once numbers are determined, teams will be posted on the web and at the event info stand.

1975 Unni Lewis—a stalwart of the Counties Manakau club, still regularly competing. Made most of the NZ team uniforms until Silva and Trimtex became available.

1976 Val Robinson—entered our 2013 Champs but did not show due to flu.

1977 P. Burbidge—see above, now known as Trish Carmichael.

1978 Anitra Dowling—Dunedin club member who went to four or five World Championships, is still competing and a mean mountainbike-orienteer.

From 1979 onwards the NZ Championships were dominated by Trish Aspin (CM) who I think won the Elite title five or six times before many more successful wins in the various veteran grades. She has also been the highest ranked NZ competitor on the World Veteran scene over the last 30 years.

I hope all the present day Elite women have as much fun, and manage 40 years of orienteering around the world.

General Information

WHISTLES EVERYONE please note that carrying a whistle while running a course is recommended.

Cancellations: Events are usually only cancelled in the event of extreme conditions such as heavy snow, flooding, dangerous river conditions etc., which are more likely to affect mountain areas. Should an event be cancelled, **NewstalkZB 1098 AM** will be notified. Cancellations are repeated half-hourly from 6:00am, then hourly from 9:00am.

Start times: vary and are published in the event notices. For most club events registration is from 10:00am, the first start is 10:30am and the last start is 1:00pm. Course closure is 2:30pm so late starters only have 90 minutes for their run

Finishing and Course Closure: Please remember to always come to the finish area, whether you finished your course or not and hand in your control card or punch the finish box, so that we can account for everyone who started. Course closure is the time at which you MUST have returned to the finish area even if you have not yet completed your course. It is at this time that the organisers may start taking in controls (and looking for you if you have not returned).

Helpers: All members are asked to be helpers during the year. The Volunteer Co-ordinator will contact you by email or by phone and the Chief Organiser will contact you shortly afterwards to make arrangements. Please contact them when you arrive at the event. Helpers who set up/pack up/work on registration may opt for a free run on the day or receive VIP points.

Control collection: Please offer to collect controls at the end of the event and receive VIP points.

Dogs: No dogs on farmland please!

Permanent Courses: Three are available, with options to suit a wide range of abilities, including beginners/children and experienced orienteers. **Victoria Park:** maps (\$3.50) and full instructions are available at the Christchurch City Council Beckenham Service Centre, 66 Colombo St. (Open normal business hours; ph: 332-3099) and at the Port Hills Visitor Centre, Victoria Park. Groups planning to use the course should let the Ranger know beforehand by phoning 332-9889. **Spencer Park:** maps and instructions are available at the Spencer Park Camp Shop, \$3 each. **Hokitika:** a park and street map outside CHCH but under PAPO's care. Starting in Cass Square Hokitika. Maps are available (FREE!) from the Hokitika Visitor Information Centre (i-site) or Westland District Council. You will need a pencil to write down the codes on the control.

Library: The club has a collection of orienteering books etc. available for members to borrow in the caravan. General introduction to orienteering, plus training, coaching, course setting, fitness, and rogaining are covered by the 16 or so titles on the list. Some are older 10–20 year-old "classics", but we have recently added some new publications. **In addition, look on the website** → **Web Page Links** → **'the Little Book of Orienteering Techniques'**.
