

Peninsula & Plains Orienteers Inc. Strategic Plan 2019-2023

INTRODUCTION

The aim of this strategic plan is to provide guidance on how the Peninsula & Plains Orienteering Club plans to operate over the following several years up until mid-2023.

This plan has been developed from a range of previous Strategic plans and feedback obtained across the club members. All activities in the plan aim to increase the opportunities for members to:

- Be involved in developing new skills Coaching
- Be part of the community and develop a sense of belonging Community
- Provide opportunities to take part in Orienteering Competition

BACKGROUND

Peninsula & Plains Orienteers Inc. has one of the largest membership bases across NZ Orienteering clubs. We have a broad cross-section of ages within the membership, and an annual attrition rate that is comparable with other Orienteering clubs, and indeed many other sports.

Other **Strengths** include:

- Strong financial base
- Highly skilled volunteers
- High number of Senior Members
- Wide range of up to date equipment and maps
- Good relationships with landowners
- Enthusiastic, committed, and capable committee

Weaknesses include:

- Disproportionate number of skilled volunteers
- Continuous need to update equipment and maps
- Communication and notifications of events
- Limited support from local businesses, politicians and service organisations

Our current **Opportunities** include:

- Promotion of Orienteering through Training, Education and Coaching
- Providing opportunities to increase the club skill base
- Promotion of Orienteering to schools and school camp venues
- Grants by local authorities and other organisations to encourage sport and community development can assist with covering costs
- Growth of interest in Rogaines and Adventure racing could provide new

members

Our current **Threats** include:

- Loss of access to mapped areas
- Increasing difficulty to satisfy landowners Health and Safety requirements
- Growth of interest in Rogaines with no requirement for assistance from participants
- Competition for volunteer time increasing through a general broadening of other activities and interests available to people, longer working hours, etc
- Children who have become interested in Orienteering through school unable to attend without transport

	Increase the number of A-grade controllers via ONZ Controller courses
	Hold regular Mapping sessions for those interested in learning

	Investigate holding more social events (such as Training evenings, JWOC reports, quiz night fund raisers etc)

	Investigate the expansion of the OY series (see: 2.1)
3.3	Maintain technology
From 2019 we will:	Put in place a maintenance plan for SI equipment
	Continue to look for opportunities to increase our efficiency through the use of technology
	Expand our knowledge base of skilled SI and O-lynx operators
