At last year's AGM discussion regarding late fees and has been left to the committee to discuss further. The committee has agreed not to change the lates fees and it now applies to all members. Further discussion below.

## 5. Presidents Report submitted by Jenni Adams

Moved: Chrissie Williams Seconded: Iona Powell carried by voice vote

Jenni: thought about handing in the 2022 report again. Another good successful year for events that were put on. A lot of MTBO events and good numbers compared to other clubs in New Zealand. PAPO did not hold a major event in the last 12 months apart from SI Champs, JWOC trials and MTBO champs – so entry fee revenue was down. It was commented that PAPO has a lot of people under 40 doing orienteering compared to other clubs around the country.

Very proud of 2023 international representatives. 50% of the JWOC team and most successful JWOC team ever.

Was very sad news with two members being lost over the last 12 months – Rayner and Josie.

## 6. Treasurers Report submitted by Iona Powell

#### Moved: Iona Powell Seconded: Trich Faulkner carried by voice vote

lona acknowledged Josie Boland who did some grant applications and the roll over of the membership database. And to Graeme Read who now banks the cash from events.

Thanks to Bruce Steven for help in preparation of the financial statements and the format of the reports as a lot of work had gone into that. Will appoint the same auditor.

Loss for 2023 due to lack of major events run over the twelve months to 30 June 2023. Paid a coach over summer. Paid out a lot in travel grants. Membership is slightly more than 2022 even though membership fees went up. Further details in the treasurers report already circulated.

PAPO is not a money making club but we do need income to maintain equipment, pay for coaching etc. There are differences in profitability of events, especially for the events which are put on out of Christchurch. Compare the profitability of the NZ MTBO Champs based in Christchurch to the Canty and SI Champs based outside Christchurch. A discussion might be needed on entry fees for out of town events.

Mapping spend was less than previously. One new map was red zone MTBO map. Other expenses were map updates. Also noted the Willows map for MTBO Champs was made and Alister Metherell's time was donated. Alan Moore also said the Hillmorton map was completed.

Junior travel fund – was supposed to be capped at \$5,000 but went just over due to special circumstances. International travel grant does not have a cap.

Noted that ONZ levies will change going forward to be more equitable across all of the clubs.

Aaron Prince – the coach in residence was also doing mapping and other personal coaching to members. Helped out at events as well. The \$2,000 was well spent.

Alister Metherell – congratulations to Iona and Bruce regarding the presentation of the financial statements and the breakdown of event profitability.

lona noted that mapping costs are not attributed to the individual events, apart from some specific circumstances, e.g. Nationals.

Membership secretary – this was Jocelyn Thrower but Jocelyn had stepped aside when we moved to Revolutionise Sport (ONZ led-initiative). The work is the reconciliation of members to payments. Jenni said it was a lot more automated and was easier to so now and Iona mentioned this was the software we send all emails and communications from. Trish Faulkner noted that this has meant a loss of personal touch to new members. However, Iona does know who is a new member when they join.

Alister – need to push ONZ to have an entry system that is linked to the members record with ONZ. Would be good to have a check as this did cause issues at the MTBO Champs.

No change to individuals and families. The proposal is to drop the team fee and the introduction to orienteering fee. Neither are supported by Enter O and this will make everything more streamlined for Enter O. It will take out paying by bank transfer and you will be able to enter using VIP points as well. Means no reconciliation apart from the VIP points. Jason asked if this would impact anyone – Alan said no, the teams and intro to orienteering fees were very rarely used.

Enter on the day pricing – wanted to encourage people to pre-enter so set enter on the day pricing at non-members pricing.

Entry close date: currently as midnight at Thursday which only gives Friday to sort the maps. Change being considered to a Wednesday midnight cutoff unless anyone has any objections. Sarah Steele said hardly any cash entries on the day, usually all by VIP points. Only some who are using VIP points to enter are not pre-entered. Alister – have a code through EnterO to enter instead of a card. Alan – using VIP points as an entry method is the first step. Aaron – upside is putting entry cutoff on Thursday is you can look at the weather but hard thing is if anything happens at CQ on the Friday there is a risk maps will not be printed. Jenni isn't particularly concerned about this as you can sort things up front.

Alister – new changes to Incorporated Societies Act. Marcus has volunteered to help with the club rules once ONZ has researched this area.
